

**ANDHRA PRADESH ACTS, ORDINANCES AND
REGULATIONS ETC..**

The following Act of the Andhra Pradesh Legislative Assembly received the assent of the Governor on the 21st October, 1991 and the said asset is hereby first published on the 23rd, October, 1991 in the Andhra Pradesh Gazette for general information

ACT NO: 25 OF 1991.

An Act to provide for the Constitution and Regulation of an Armed Force of the State for Protection and Security of Government Treasuries, Institutions owned and controlled by the State and also to provide Protection and Security to the Autonomous Bodies, Establishments, Institutions, Industrial Undertakings and the Employees of all such industrial under taking and for matters connected there with or incidental there to.

BE it enacted by Legislative Assembly of the State of Andhra Pradesh in the Forty second year of the Republic of India as follows:-

1. (1) This Act may be called the Andhra Pradesh Special Protection Force Act 1991.

(2) It extends to the whole of the State of Andhra Pradesh.

(3) It shall come into force on such date as the State Government may, by notification appoint.

Definitions. 2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,-

(a) 'Armed force' means the Special Protection Force constituted under section 3:

(b) 'Autonomous body' means an institution wholly or partially run on the funds or grants of or controlled by the Governments:

(c) 'Director-General' means the Director-General of the Force appointed under section 4:

(d) 'enrolled member of the Force means any subordinate officer, under officer or any other member of the Force of the rank not lower than that of an under officer;

(e) 'establishment' means an office, guest house or such other institutions run by the Government;

(f) 'Force custody' means the arrest or confinement of a member of the force in accordance with the rules made under this Act;

(g) 'Government' means Government of Andhra Pradesh;

(h) 'industrial undertaking' means any undertaking pertaining to a scheduled industry and includes an undertaking engaged in any other industry, or in any trade, business or service which may be regulated by law made by the Parliament or Legislative Assembly of the State;

(I) 'industrial undertaking in public sector' means an industrial undertaking owned, controlled or managed by the Government and includes

(i) a Government company as Central Act defined in section 617 of the Companies 1 of 1956. Act, 1956;

(ii) A Corporation established and is controlled by the Governments;

(j) 'Managing Director' in relation to an industrial undertaking, means the person, who exercises control over the affairs of that undertaking and includes a general manager, manager, chief executive officer or called by any other name;

(k) 'Member of the Force' means a person appointed as such to the Force under this Act;

(l) 'Prescribed' means prescribed by rules made under this Act;

(m) 'scheduled industry' means any industry engaged in the manufacture or production of the articles mentioned in the First Schedule to the Industries Development and Regulation Act, 1951;

(n) 'State' means the state of Andhra Pradesh;

(o) 'Strategic and vital installation' means all such vulnerable points or areas as specified by the Government from time to time, and declared essential for the maintenance of the life of the community and which requires special protection against sabotage;

(p) 'Subordinate officer' means a person appointed to the force as an Inspector person appointed to the force as an Inspector, a Sub-Inspector or an assistant Sub- Inspector;

(q) 'Supervisory officer' means any of the officers appointed under section 4 and includes any other officer appointed by the Government as supervisory officer of the Force;

(r) 'Under officer' means a person appointed to the Force as a Head Constable, or Constable.

Constitution 3. (1) The Government shall, as soon as may be after the commencement of the Force of this Act, by notification constitute of this Act, by notification constitute an armed force called "The Andhra Pradesh Special Protection force".

(2) The Force shall consist of such number of supervisory officers, subordinate officers, under officers and other enrolled members and shall receive such pay and other remuneration as may be prescribed.

(3) The Headquarters of the Force shall be at Hyderabad or at such other places as may be specified by the Government from time to time.

Appointment and powers of the Director General and Supervisory officers: 4. (1) The Government may appoint a person to be Director-General of the force and may appoint other person to be Inspectors-General, Deputy Inspectors General, Commandants, Deputy Commandants and Assistant Commandants of the Force.

(2) The Director-General and every other supervisor officer so appointed under sub-section (1) shall have and may exercise, such powers and perform such duties as may be prescribed.

Appointment of enrolled members of the Force. 5. The Director-General or such supervisor officer as may be authorized by the Government shall enroll member and perform such duties as may be prescribed.

Certificates of members of the Force 6. Every enrolled member under section 5 shall be granted on his appointment, a certificate in the form prescribed under the seal of the Director-General or such other supervisory officer as the Director General may specify in this behalf, and the person holding such certificate shall exercise the powers of an enrolled member of the Force and perform such duties as may be prescribed.

7. (1) The Director-General shall be the principal administrative officer of the Force subject to the overall control of the Government. He shall exercise such powers and perform such duties as may be prescribed.

Superintendence
and
administration
of the Force

(2) Subject to the provisions of the sub-sections (1) the administration of the force within such local limits as may be prescribed shall be carried on by the Inspector-General, Deputy Inspector General, Commandant, Deputy Commandant or Assistant Commandant in accordance with the provisions of this Act and any rules made there under and every supervisory officer placed in charge of the protection and security of Government Treasuries, Institutions, autonomous bodies, industrial undertakings assets owned and controlled by the State and Central Governments and strategic and vital installations in the State shall function on such terms and conditions as may be prescribed and shall be subject to any direction that may be given by the Government or the Director-General in this behalf, discharge his functions under the general supervision, direction and control of the authority in charge of the institutions, autonomous bodies or strategic and vital installations and managing directors of industrial undertakings.

8. It shall be the duty of every officer and member of the Force:-

Duties of
members of
the Force

- (i) to obey and execute all orders lawfully issued to him by his supervisors authority;
- (ii) to protect and safeguard the Government Treasuries, institutions, autonomous bodies, industrial undertakings and assets owned and controlled by the State Government or strategic and vital installations under their control;
- (iii) to protect and safeguard such other industrial undertaking and installations for the protection and security or which he is deputed under section 9;
- (iv) to protect and safeguard the employee of the Industrial Undertakings and installations referred to in clauses (ii) and (iii)

- (v) To do any other act conducive to the protection and security of the institutions, autonomous bodies, industrial undertakings and assets or strategic and vital installations reoffered to in clauses (ii) and (iii) and the employees referred to in clause (iv).

Deputation of
the Force.

9. Subject to any general direction of the Government and the recovery of charge of the force on such terms and conditions as may be prescribed under clause (J) of sub-sections (2) of section 21 of the Act, it shall be lawful for the Director-General on a request received in this behalf from the authority in charge of the establishments, institutions, autonomous bodies, industrial undertakings and assets or strategic vital installations which are not owned or controlled by the state Governments or which are financed, owned or controlled by the Central Government, showing the necessity thereof, to the Force as the Director-General may consider necessary for the protection and security thereof and any installations attached thereto and the members of the force so deputed shall be at the charge of such officer or authority as the charge of such officer or authority as directed by the Director-General or any other officer on his behalf:

Provided that in the case of an establishment, institutions, autonomous body, undertaking, strategic or vital installation controlled or managed

(a) by a Government Company in which the Government is not having interest, no such request shall be entertained unless it is made with the consent of the Director-General or with the approval of the Government;

(b) if the Director-General is of the opinion that the circumstance necessitating the deputation of the members of the force in relation to an institutions, autonomous body, an industrial undertaking and asset or strategic and vital installations under sub-clause (a) have ceased to exist, he may withdraw the members of the Force so deputed without assigning any reason thereof;

(c) every member of the Force while discharging his functions during the period of deputation shall continue to exercise the same power and be subject to the same responsibilities, discipline and penalties as would have been applicable to him under this Act, if he had been discharging those duties in relation to an establishment, an institution, an autonomous body, an industrial undertaking and assets or strategic and vital installation of State Government.

10. (1) Any member of the Force, without any order from a magistrate and without a warrant arrest:- Power to arrest with out warrant.

(i) any person, who voluntarily causes hurt to or attempts voluntarily causes hurt to, or wrongfully restrains or assaults threatens to assault or uses or threatens or attempts to use criminal Force to any employee; referred to in clause (iv) of section 8, or to him or any other member of the force discharge of his duty as such employee or in execution of his duty as such member, as that case may be, or with intent to prevent or to deter him from discharging his duty as such member or in consequence of anything done or attempted to be done by him in the lawful discharging of his duty as such member.

(ii) any person who has been concerned in, or against whom a reasonable suspicion exist of his having been concerned in or who is found taking precautions to conceal his presence under circumstances which afford to believe that he is taking such precautions with a view to committing, a cognizable offence which relates to property belonging to, or in the premises of, any establishment, institution, autonomous body, industrial under- taking and assets or any strategic and vital installations referred to in clauses (ii) and (iii) of section 8, or relates to other installations, or to property in the premises of the other installation, referred to in these clauses or the establishments, institutions, autonomous bodies, industrial undertakings and assets or strategic vital installations for the protection of which he is deputed under section9;

(iii) any person who commits or attempts to commit a cognizable offence which involves or which is likely to involve danger, to the life of any person engaged in carrying on any work relating to any establishment, institution, autonomous body, undertaking, or installations referred to in clauses (ii) of this sub- section.

(2) If any person is found trespassing on the premises of any industrial undertaking referred to in clause (ii) of sub-section (1), he may, without prejudice to any other proceedings which may be taken against him, be removed from such premises by any member of the Force.

Power to search without warrant.

11. (1) Whenever any member of the Force, has reason to believe that any such offence as is referred to in section 10 has been or is being committed and that a search warrant cannot be obtained without affording the offender an opportunity of escaping or concealing evidence of the offence, he may detain the offender and search his person, belonging and premises for with and, if he thinks proper, arrest any person whom he has reason to believe to have committed the offence.

(2) the provisions of the code of Central Criminal Procedure 1973 relating to searches Act 2 under that code shall , so far as may be, of 1974 apply to searches under this section. Central Act 2 of 1974

12. Any member of the Force making an procedure arrest under this Act, shall, without to be unnecessary delay, make over the person so followed arrested to a police officer, or, in the after absence of police office. Take such arrest person or cause him to be taken to the nearest police station together with a report of the circumstances occasioning the arrest.

Procedure to be followed after arrest

13. No suit or prosecution shall be protection entertained in any Court against the Force of action or again in any officer or member of the done in Force or against any person acting under good faith the order or direction of the Force or any officer or member of the Force for anything which is in good faith done or intended to be done under this Act or any rules made there under.

Protection of action done in good faith

14. No court shall take cognizance or cognizance an offence against any member of the Force of offence with regard to any act done by him while discharging or purporting to act in the discharge of his duty except with the prior sanction of the Government.

Cognizance of offence

15. (1) Every member of the Force shall be considered to be always on duty and shall, at any time, be liable to be employed at any place within the state of Andhra Pradesh and out side also.

Members of the Force to be considered always on the duty and liable to be employed any where in the State and out side also

(2) No member of the Force shall engage himself in any employment or office other than his duties under this Act.

(3) A member of the Force shall not and out by reason of his suspension from his side also. Office cease to be a member of the Force: and he shall during that period be subject to the same responsibilities, discipline

and penalties to which he would have been subject if he were on duty.

Punishments and appeals 16. (1) Subject to the provisions of Article. 311, the Director-General of the Force may appoint any of the supervisory officers to impose such penalties after conducting enquires in accordance with the provisions of the Andhra Pradesh Civil Services (Classifications, Control and Appeal) Rules, 1963 and non-appealable penalties by way of summary disposal in the manner prescribed.

Explanation: - For the purpose of the this section,--

- (a) Punishments classified as non appealable shall consists of,--
 - 1. Fatigue duty:
 - 2. Extra Drill, and
 - 3. Confinement to barracks for seven days: and

- (b) Punishments which are classified as appealable shall consist of,--
 - 1. Censure.
 - 2. Fine.
 - 3. Withholding of increment or promotion.
 - 4. Reduction in Rank.
 - 5. Recovery from pay.
 - 6. Compulsory retirement.
 - 7. Removal from service.
 - 8. Dismissal from service; and
 - 9. Suspension:

Provided that in respect of class (b) of punishments an appeal shall lie within thirty days from the date of the communication of the order to such appellate authority as may be prescribed.

17. (1) No member of the Force, shall, without the precious sanction in writing of the Government or of the prescribed authority,--

Restrictions repecting rights to form Association.

(a) be a member of, or be associated in any way with, any trade union, labour union, political party or with any class of trade unions, labour unions or political parties; or

(b) be a member of, or be associated in any way with, any other society, institution, association or organization that is not recognized as part of the Force or is not of a purely social, recreational or religious nature; or;

Explanation:- If any question arises as to whether any society, institution, association or organization is of purely social, recreational or religious nature under clause (b) of this Sub-section; the decision of the Government thereon shall be final.

(2) No member of the Force shall participate in or address, any meeting or take part in any demonstration organized by anybody of persons for any political purpose or for such other purpose as may be prescribed.

18. (1) Every person who for any reason ceases to be an enrolled member of the Force, shall forthwith surrender to any supervisory officer empowered to receive the same, his certificate of appointment the arms, accoutrements, clothing and other articles which have been furnished to him for the performance of duties as an enrolled member of the Force.

Surrender of certificate arms etc., by persons ceasing to be members of the Force.

(2) Any person who wilfully neglects or refuses to surrender the articles as required by sub- section (1) shall be liable for forfeiture of financial benefits and prosecution under the Law.

(3) Nothing in this connection shall be deemed to apply to any article which, under the orders of the Director-General, has become the property of the person to whom the same was furnished.

Application of Act, 1922 to the members of the Force. 19. The Police (Incitement to disaffection) Act, 1922, shall apply to members of the Force as it applies to members of a Police Force.

Certain Acts not to apply to members of the Force 20. Nothing contained in the payment of Wages Act, 1936, or the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947, or the Factories Act, 1948, except the provisions relating to health and safety or any corresponding law relating to investigation and settlement of industrial disputes in force in the state shall apply to members of the Force.

Power to make Rules. 21. (1) The Government shall, in addition to the rule making powers conferred on them by any other provisions of this Act, have power to make rules generally to carry out all or any of the purpose of this Act.

(2) In particular and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing powers, such rules may provide for,

(a) regulating the classes, ranks, grades, pay and remuneration of members of the Force and their conditions of service in the Force;

(b) regulating the powers and duties of members of the Force authorised to exercise any functions by or under this act;

(c) fixing the period of service for members of the Force;

(d) prescribing the description and quantity of arms, accountrements, clothing and other necessary articles to be furnished to the members of the force;

(e) prescribing the places of residence of members of the Force;

(f) institution, management and regulation of any fund for any purpose connected with the administration of the Force;

(g) regulating the punishments and prescribing authorities to whom appeals may be preferred from orders of punishment, or remission of fines or other punishments, and the procedure to be followed for the disposal of such appeals;

(h) regulating matters with respect of Force custody under this Act including the procedure to be followed for taking persons into custody;

(i) regulating matters with respect to disposal of cases relating to offences under this act and specifying places in which persons convicted under this Act may be confined;

(j) the terms and conditions subject to which members to the Force may be deputed under section 9 and the charges thereof.

(3) Every rule made under this Act, shall immediately after it is made, be laid before the Legislative Assembly of the State if it is in session and if it is not in session, in the session immediately following, for a total period of fourteen days which may be comprised in one session or in two successive sessions, and if before the expiration of the session in which it is so laid or the session immediately following the Legislative Assembly agrees in making any modification in the rule or in the annulment of the rule, the rule shall, from the date on which the modification or annulment is notified, have effect only in such modified form or shall stand annulled as the case may be, so however, that any such modification or annulment shall be without prejudice to the validity of anything previously done under that rule.

SPECIAL RULES FOR ANDHRA PRADESH SPECIAL PROTECTION FORCE SUB-ORDINATE SERVICE

[G.O.Ms.No.208, Home (Police.F), 20th August,1997]

The State of Andhra Pradesh, is endowed with rich natural resources like minerals, power projects etc. As a result of industrial development, economic activity in the State has enormously increased and number of banks, Government treasuries, Research Institutes, ancillary industries, defence production units and other sensitive establishments have come up from time to time. The economic and industrial growth in the State is posing a challenge to the Law and Order machinery and at present the Government and quasi-Government establishments are inadequately protected resulting in insecurity in their protection. Apart from this, the strategic and vital installations which are declared by the Government from time to time requires special protection against sabotage during peace and war which has exerted additional pressure on the Police force. The Special strike forces like District Armed Reserve and Special Police Force are sufficient to control law and order requirements only but not sufficient to safeguard the District Treasuries, Sub-Treasuries, etc.

In order to overcome the afore said difficulty Government have enacted the Andhra Pradesh Special protection Force, Act 1991. As per section 21 of Andhra Pradesh, Special protection Force Act 1991, the Government is empowered to make rules generally to carry out all or any of the purpose of the Act, regulating the classes, ranks, grades, pay and remuneration of members of the Force and their conditions of service in the Force.

Accordingly the Government issue the Special rules for the Andhra Pradesh Special protection Force Sub-ordinate Service as in the notification appended to this order.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 21 of the Andhra Pradesh Special Protection Force Act, 1991 read with the proviso to article 309 of the constitution of India and of all other powers here unto enabling the Governor of Andhra Pradesh hereby makes the following rules relating to the Andhra Pradesh Special Protection Force Subordinate Service.

RULES

1. Short title: These Rules may be called the Andhra Pradesh Special Protection Force Subordinate Service Rules, 1995.
2. Constitution: The service shall consist of the following classes and category of posts

3. Method of appointment and appointing authority:

Appointment to the several categories mentioned in rule 2 shall be made as indicated in the Annexure-I to these rules

4. Qualifications:

No person shall be eligible for appointment to various categories in these Rules, unless he/she possess the qualifications prescribed for the post as indicated in the Annexure-II to these rules.

5. Age:

The upper age limit for various categories included in the service is as indicated in the Annexure-III to these rules.

6. Training:

Any person appointed to any category in this service shall undergo training for such period and in such manner as may be prescribed by the State Government in this behalf in consultation with the Inspector General of Police, Special Protection Force and Director General and Inspector General of Police.

7. Probation:

Every person appointed by direct recruitment shall be on probation for a total period of two years on duty within a continuous period of three years and every person appointed by promotion or by transfer shall be on probation for a total period of one year on duty within a continuous period of two years from the date of commencement of probation.

8. Area of Service:

A member of the service shall be liable to serve in any part of the State or when so ordered by the State Government, in any part of India outside the State of Andhra Pradesh.

9. Uniform:

The members of the service shall be entitled to supply of uniform on such scale as may be prescribed by the State Government from time to time.

10. Uniform Grant:

Members of the Service shall be entitled to uniform grant at the rates applicable to their counterparts in the Andhra Pradesh Police Subordinate Service.

O R D E R:

The State of Andhra Pradesh is endowed with rich natural resources like minerals, power projects etc. As a result of industrial development and economic activity in the State a number of banks, Government Treasuries, Research Institutes, ancillary industries, defence production units and other sensitive establishments have come up from time to time. The economic and industrial growth in the State is posing a challenge to the Law and Order machinery and at present the Government and quasi Government establishments are inadequately protected resulting in and vital installations which are declared by the Government from time to time require special protection against sabotage during peace and war which has exerted additional pressure on the Police Force. The Special Strike Forces like District Armed Reserve and Special Police Force are sufficient to control Law and Order requirements but not sufficient to safeguard the District Treasuries, Sub-Treasuries and other establishments referred to above.

In order to overcome the aforesaid difficulty, Government have enacted the Andhra Pradesh Special Protection Force Act, 1991. As per Section 21 of the said Act, the Government is empowered to make rules generally to carry out all or any of the purposes of the Act, regulating the classes, ranks, grades, pay and remuneration of members of the Force and conditions of their service.

Therefore, the Government have proposed to issue the Andhra Pradesh Protection Force Service Rules, 2000.

R U L E S

1. Short Title:

These rules may be called the Andhra Pradesh Special Protection Force Rules, 2000.

2. Constitution:

The service shall consist of the following classes and categories of posts, namely:

C L A S S -A

Category – 1: Deputy Inspector General, Special Protection Force (Non-Cadre).

Category – 2: Commandant or Additional Commandant, Special Protection Force.

Category – 3: Assistant Commandant, Special Protection Force.

Category -4: Inspector, Special Protection Force.

C L A S S -B (Technical)

Category – 1: Inspector (Communication and Computers), Special Protection Force.

Category – 2: Inspector (Motor Transport Organisation), Special Protection Force.

3. Method of appointment and appointing authority:

Subject to the other provisions in these rules, the method of appointment to all the categories mentioned in rule 2 shall be as follows:

(1) No person shall be eligible for appointment by promotion or appointment by transfer for categories 1 and 2 of Class -A and Category 1 of Class-B unless he or she possesses a degree of the recognized University of India.

2) **Special Qualifications:**

No person shall be eligible for appointment by transfer for Category 3 of Class-A Assistant Commandant, Special Protection Force, unless he or she fulfills the following conditions:-

- a) Shall be a Graduate from a recognised University of India

No person shall be eligible for appointment by promotion of appointment by transfer unless he or she has put in not less than three years of service but in no case

shall it be less than two years in the category, class or grade from which appointment by promotion or transfer is made.

5. Qualification:

(1) No person shall be eligible for appointment by promotion or appointment by transfer for categories 1 and 2 of Class –A and Category 1 of Class-B unless he or she possesses a degree of the recognized University of India.

(2) **Special Qualifications:**

No person shall be eligible for appointment by transfer for Category 3 of Class-A Assistant Commandant, Special Protection Force, unless he or she fulfills the following conditions:

- a) Shall be a Graduate from a recognised University of India
- (b) shall be an approved probationer in the category of Deputy Superintendent of Police or Assistant Commandant;
- (c) shall have good record of service and maintain clean defaulter sheet without any major punishment;
- (d) shall not be more than 42 years of age as on the date of appointment by transfer.

6. Probation:

Every person appointed by promotion or transfer shall be on probation for a total period of one year on duty within a continuous period of two years.

7. Appointment on Tenure Basis:

The appointment on tenure basis to any post in this service shall not ordinarily be for more than three years at a time. Extension for a further period of two years shall be decided by the Government where such extension is considered necessary in public Interest:

Provided that nothing in these rules shall preclude the Government or Inspector General of Police, Special Protection Force as the case may be, to repatriate the officers taken on tenure basis to their respective parent departments even before expiry of the tenure period without assigning any reasons.

8. General:

(a) No person shall be eligible for appointment by promotion or for appointment by transfer unless he or she has satisfactorily completed the period of probation in the category from which appointment by promotion or appointment by transfer is made.

(b) The length of service rendered in Class - A or in Class - B categories shall be considered commonly for appointment by promotion to the next higher categories either in Class - A or in Class - B.

(d) Should not possess Knocking-knees, pigeon, chest, flat foot, varicose veins, Hammer toes, fractured limbs, decayed teeth, stammering, hard of hearing and abnormal psychological behaviour.

(e) Should not possess HIV Positive (HIV +ve).

in rule 5; the following proviso shall be added, namely "Provided that the upper age limits prescribed under clauses (b) and (c) of sub-rule (1) of rule 12 of Andhra Pradesh State and subordinate Service Rules 1996 shall apply" the upper age limit for the HGs who fall within the definition specified in these rules shall not have crossed 30 years of age in respect of recruitment to the post of Constable.
